During its spell at Sunningdale Classics, where we purchased him from, he had been subject to an expensive "going over" by the mechanical staff at a certain RR and Bentley dealer in the Worcestershire region.

This was done to make sure we didn't have any problems with the car once we had driven it away and the accompanying invoice made my eyes water when I saw the amount that had been paid out by the dealer. "They're not going to make much money on this one", I thought, and I was probably right.

Remembering all that I had been taught regarding these magnificent machines, I used Humpty at every opportunity and that was such a chore I felt I had to drive him gain and again.

Now the nice thing about driving a Rolls-Royce, is that everyone looks at you and slows down on dual carriageways as they pass you to see who you are, although I do wonder which important person would have the registration EGG. They also give way to you at junctions as you waft across them ...and as for being really important?

On one of my regular jaunts I was driving up the A45 out of Coventry when I was stopped at traffic lights. "How dare they" I thought! No, not really, but I left the car in D whilst I was stopped.

Now with other automatics I have I never leave it in D for more than a couple of minutes, and Humpty, I thought, wouldn't be any exception. Oh dear. There was an ever so polite "ping" and in big orange letters in front of me where the words, "Gearbox Fault".

Oh botheration! I thought, that sounds expensive and I have to admit, a mild feeling of panic crept in. I quickly pulled in to the side of the road after I had passed the traffic lights and switched everything off.

A couple of minutes later, I switched everything back on and started the engine – well that's what my computer training told me to do so it might work here as well.

Bingo! Humpty started and there were no orange warning lights. "I'd better get home quickly", I said to myself and turning the car around made for home. On the journey back, I boxed clever and stopping at a set of traffic lights slipped the gear lever into Neutral. No polite ping and no warning lights and that was the end of that.

Until the next time!!!

A couple of days later, the same thing happened and using the same trick of switching off and back on... I was really learning fast and getting quite pleased with myself... everything went back to normal. However, this issue really intrigued me.

Now I had in the past driven 94 seat double deck coaches for Megabus on the Birming-ham London route and I know that 45 seconds is the maximum permitted time to leave these vehicles in D when stopped for any reason.

Surely Rolls-Royce were not like that, after all Jaguar certainly weren't. So, firing up the old computer at home, I asked the question of several RR Bentley forums. I was amazed at the answers that came back.

The best one was it's a sensor and will do no damage at all, just ignore it, to the gearbox is about to explode and a new one will cost several thousand pounds. I had grave visions of a massive expense bill looming and even worse, selling our new-found love.

Upon sleeping on all of this, I decided to ask the experts at a RR service centre. There must be one near Coventry I thought. So, armed with the magic words and Google I found there were none in Coventry, the nearest being Starman Rolls and Bentley specialists next door to Flying Spares at Market Bosworth.

Now getting to know the Father and Son team's names were Duane and Kyle, this didn't fill me with much hope and I had visions of a right fly by night or here today and gone today also operation.

But their webpage did show many fine machines at their premises including one from France and a very old Wraith. Ah well, give them a ring, nothing lost by that at least.

Talking to Duane Starman on the phone was like a breath of fresh air. I described the problem. Easy he said, the engine tick over isn't right and when you stop in gear, the ECU expects the engine to make the car move forward. Instead it's staying put and the gearbox throws a message to the ECU which puts its hands up, gives in and throws a fit and warning message.

Bring it in and I'll give it a good going over, service and check why the engine isn't right.

Humpty was duly booked in and driven over on the day. Chris followed in her XF to bring me home as it was expected the car would be there for a few days. As soon as Kyle, Duane's son heard the engine, he exclaimed that there was an air leak somewhere, probably from the throttle body gasket on the inlet manifold.

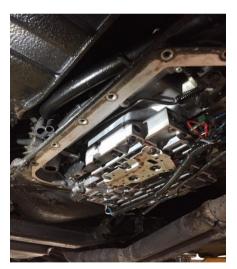
With hindsight, it was as if he had already seen and had the car for a week as he was perfectly correct, there was air leak from the manifold/throttle body.





Duane and Kyle had the car for nearly a week and discovered the bottom ball joints were on their last legs, but he was able to shim them and fit a replacement kit, which apparently saved us about £400 each side.

The guys also changed the engine oils and gearbox oil and filters, checking the antifreeze strength, distributor belts, rear spring cups, which were badly corroded and everything else they could possibly think of. So much for the pre delivery check from that well know RR dealer in Worcestershire, something that I'm not going to dwell on as I don't know what the arrangement





between the dealer and themselves was. We picked the car up a week later and after raiding the OAP fund, paid the bill, which on hindsight wasn't too bad considering the work they had to do.

Starman's also kept a photographic record and posted regularly on their Facebook page so we could see what was happening with Humpty. I really have to admit that he was missed while he was away and the cry of "pouvre Humpty" was regularly heard.



The following week, Humpty attended his first event, a breakfast meeting of the West Midlands Classic Car Club, a none too serious bunch of petrol heads who meet up every so often to have breakfast and a natter about our cars.

I have to say that Humpty looked resplendent next to a big American Chevy, they were about the same size as well.

All went well until half a mile from home, there was a very polite "ping" again...this time with a flashing red light which stated "ride height fault". "Oh calamity", I retorted, "not again". Visions of the OAP fund and the holiday fund up to 2025 being raided flashed through my mind.

Rounding the corner of our road, the red warning light grew in size, and incorporated the wording STOP and LOW BRAKE FLUID LEVEL! It was a good job that we were almost on the drive when this happened.

Now I don't know about you, but as the years pass me by, the urge to get down on my hands and knees in freezing cold weather diminishes somewhat. So a week later I got down on those very same hands and knees and looked at what the problem was.

A little green brake pipe on the O/S front calliper was dripping, ever so slightly, a clear fluid. Now these little green pipes can be found on both front callipers and they are perfectly formed with 90 degree right angle turns, which get a bit thinner than they first were >



The green pipes can be clearly seen in this picture. A quick call was made to the Starman depot again. You know you can really get an impression of people totally wrong, until you really get to know them.

"Are you at home next Wednesday afternoon?" came the reply to my obvious question. "OK, we'll be over around 2.30".

Sure enough at 2.30 a white Silver Spirit pulls up outside and out jump Duane and Kyle.

Three hours later, and in the dark, they had removed all six pipes, re manufactured them in my tiny workshop – a kitchen table with a vice bolted on to it, replaced the said pipes, bled the system and checked everything was ok. The cost...well I'm not telling, although it was incredibly reasonable and wouldn't cover three hours work let alone the cost of fuel for the journey.

I learnt a lot about the Starmans' that afternoon and realised that although they run a business, they are true enthusiasts and petrol heads as well as great people to know.

I will recommend them thoroughly to anyone who wants work of the highest standards carried out on their car.

Things went reasonably well then for the next couple of weeks until...

The Christmas Lunch date.

We thought this is an ideal place to show off Humpty to our new found RREC friends and set out on the not too far journey. Halfway along the M42 there was that ever so polite "ping" again and the orange legend arose, "check engine".

"Now that is a sensor somewhere", I said, "and I'm going to ignore it". I was proved right because asking those in the know at the dinner, I got the same answer from everyone. The warning light didn't come on all the way home.

We have used the car a lot in the following weeks without mishap, so I'm hoping the gremlins have gone away? One thing is certain, I'm no longer expecting the "polite ping" any more, and I'm just enjoying the Rolls-Royce and really looking forward to the Ragley Hall and Pershore events with a huge smile! 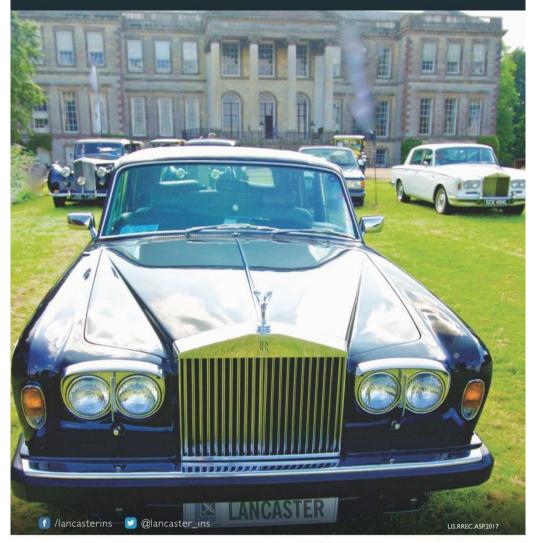
